Maintenance Tip of the Month....It's that time of year for Hurricanes! Are you prepared?

Supply Kit Items: Water—at least a 3-day supply; one gallon per person per day, Food—at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable, easy-to-prepare food, flashlight, battery-powered or hand-crank radio, extra batteries, First aid kit, Medications (7-day supply) and medical items, Sanitation and personal hygiene items, copies of personal documents, cell phone with chargers, family and emergency contact information, emergency blanket, map(s) of the area, baby supplies, pet supplies, tools/supplies for securing your home, extra set of car keys & house keys, extra clothing, hat and sturdy shoes, rain gear, Insect repellent, sunscreen, and camera for photos of damage.
