HURRICANE SAFETY: It's never too early to be prepared!

- Stay indoors.
- Don't walk on beaches, riverbanks or in flood waters.
- Use flashlights in the dark if the power goes out. Do NOT use candles.
- Continue listening to local area radio, NOAA radio or TV stations for the latest information and updates.
- Don't walk, swim or drive through floodwater. Just six inches of fast-flowing water can knock you over and two feet will float a car. If caught on a flooded road with rapidly rising waters, get out of the car quickly and move to higher ground.
- Turn off the power and water mains if instructed to do so by local authorities.
- Don't walk on beaches or riverbanks.
- Don't allow children to play in or near flood water.
- Avoid contact with floodwater. Stations may be contaminated with sewage or contain dangerous insects or animals.
- Stay out of area subject to flooding. Underpasses, dips, low spots, canyons, washes, etc. can become filled with water.
