Light management prevents disorientation of adult females (coming to lay eggs) as well as hatchlings. Disorientation leads to dehydration and wasted energy as they aimlessly try to find the ocean which also makes them easy targets for predators and more vulnerable to sickness.



REMINDERS:



Keep amber/yellow bulbs in shielded canister porch lights
Turn OFF all outside decorative lighting
Don't use unshielded fixtures
Keep blinds closed at night
Exterior fixtures should be AMBER/YELLOW bulbs only. DO NOT USE white bulbs.
Inspect all of your exterior lights including balconies, 2nd stories, front and rear of homes

Monthly Maintenance Tip

Dishwasher: For optimum efficiency, do not overload your dishwasher and only use dishwasher detergent recommended for automatic dishwashers, preferably with a spot free rinse additive for our harsh local city water. Also, prior to starting your dishwasher run the hot water first so the dishwasher will have good hot water for the first cycle. To clean the exterior of the dishwasher, wipe with a warm, damp, sudsy cloth. Rinse and wipe dry. Avoid gritty or harsh cleansers, as they will damage the finish. Generally the interior of the dishwasher is self-cleaning. The tub and strainer should be periodically checked for food debris or a foreign object.
